Our joint project activity in cooperation with the media workshop in Bergheim brought closeness, released feelings, overcame boundaries, awakened hope.




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Planning Learning Approaches for Nowadays' Students

We used the framework of Erasmus Days (15-17 October) to relaunch the project and celebrate that Erasmus exists and brings people together.



We celebrated the #Erasmus Days in Kerpen, because Erasmus brings people together, regardless of origin or status. **You can see the video [here](#).**

Despite the end of the lockdown, not all partner schools had started their regular operations in October. Nevertheless, work continued under special circumstances, and digitally. The first joint activity "**Let's go together!** - A **photo project** in cooperation with our German partner *Medienwerkstatt Katholisches Bildungsforum Rhein-Erft* aimed to bring 14 girls from the different partner countries together after so many months of shutdown and uncertainties. We created a space where the girls regained trust in each other and in the future of the project.

At the same time, the students in the project are intensively engaged in the activity **European Sports**, not only in the framework of the AG. With the development and creation of quizzes, surveys and videos (all integrated in the interactive app), the focus here was on learning and using the interactive app Genial.ly, a creative alternative for teaching e.g. with regard to Power Point.
